### P/C Lynn Pass, AP

P/C Lynn Pass, AP, who was commander of Dundalk Sail & Power Squadron in 1988-89 passed away in the Boston area on March 24<sup>th</sup>. She was also Dundalk's first mate in the years 1971-72 when her husband, Ralph Pass, Jr., SN was commander.

Lynn had been living in recent years near her son Ralph (Skip) Pass, Jr. and according to him, the end came fast with no pain or suffering on her part.

P/Lt/C Rolf Stuenes remembers Lynn as a "dear friend." P/C Bernie Karpers, N recalls meeting Lynn during a cruise in 1972 when she took him under her protection and guidance. "She was a grand lady and her death is a loss to all," states Bernie.

P/C Pass was a Star Member of Dundalk Sail & Power Squadron and had accumulated fifteen merit marks.

### Lt John Coleman, AP

Lt John R. Coleman, AP died on February 3, 2007. John was a long-time member of Dundalk Sail and Power Squadron and a Life Member of the United States Power Squadrons. He had been ill for a little more than a year, when he became inactive. About a year prior to his illness he retired and spent time traveling. He was devoted to sailing and prior to his retirement was Dundalk's sailing course instructor.

While he was active John taught the Basic Boating Course at Dulaney High School, where P/C Bernie Karpers, N (then SEO) remembered John as a great teacher and a vital member of Dundalk Sail & Power Squadron. "His loss is a profound loss to Dundalk," said Bernie.

Another former SEO, P/C Mary Hammond also recalled John teaching many classes. According to P/C Hammond, "he will live on in the hearts and minds of the many students he touched."

Per John's request his wake was a "Cheeseburger in Paradise" reception. Cheeseburgers were served in his honor. Throughout his life John had collected dozens of baseball caps. Each attendee was asked to take home a hat with them that would remind them of John.

Lt Coleman is survived by his wife Sandy.

## ★ Stars Shine on Dundalk ★ at Change of Watch

For the first time in history a chief commander (that means the commander of all the power squadrons in the nation) was present to swear in Dundalk Sail and Power Squadron's new bridge. CC Ernie Marshburn, SN administered the oath of office in Cdr John Hall and all the other new bridge members at the squadron's 46<sup>th</sup> annual Change of Watch at the Sparrows Point Country Club on March 16<sup>th</sup>.

In addition to Cdr Hall, the new bridge includes one brand new member, Administrative Officer Lt/C David Seidenman, AP. Lt/C Tracey Stuenes, P moves up to Executive Officer, while Lt/C Dick Bussey, P stays on as Treasurer, Lt/C Stuart Newborn, S remains secretary and P/C Walter Neese, SN begins his third year as squadron education officer.

Noting the presence of CC Marshburn, District Commander Kay Simpkins and numerous squadron commanders in the midst of an ice storm, outgoing Commander Bernie Karpers, N stated, "The presence of these folks who have traveled under these conditions...does say something about relationships with our squadron and the district, with our squadrons with each other and with our squadron and the national organization."

For his part, CC Marshburn told the attendees that he wanted USPS to become more visible to the general public through new programs such as USPS University, which will be launched at the upcoming National Meeting in Norfolk. The new initiative will add many courses and change the way USPS approaches education. The chief commander said he was very impressed that Dundalk had taught over 10,000 people since its founding. "You've got innovative things like the Top Gun Award that's not replicated in any other district or any other squadron," he stated. "It is clearly unique and something innovative that you've done to really showcase not only what Dundalk is but what USPS is."

Outgoing Commander Karpers made a number of awards and recognitions during the Change of Watch ceremonies. A matter of great intrigue was finally settled when Bernie named incoming Commander John Hall, AP with the squadron's famed Busted Shamrock, which goes to that member who demonstrates the greatest lapse of good sense. P/C Karpers told the crowd that he awarded Cdr Hall the Shamrock for allowing his new vessel *Battlewagon* to run hard aground during its maiden voyage. Cdr Hall edged out Lt/C Stuart Newborn, S, Lt/C David Seidenman, AP and P/C Howard Barry, JN.

Later in the evening, Cdr Hall turned the tables by presenting P/C Karpers with a "Busted Shamrock Boomerang" which you can read about in the commander's column.

The David J. Heikkila Award who goes to that member who contributes most significantly to creating a spirit of comradeship and friendship among the members, was presented to the squadron's secretary, Lt/C Stuart Newborn, S.

The Robinson Award, who is presented to a member with less than two years in the squadron who has demonstrated superior member involvement and service went to Max Robinson, S. Max was praised by P/C Karpers for bringing in a number of new members and taking on the squadron sailing and electronics courses.

P/C Karpers also presented special recognitions for service to the squadron to Dundalk's chaplain, P/C Lois Nehmer, SN and Assistant Squadron Education Officer Ray Schiff, P.

The morning after the Change of Watch, CC Marshburn and D/C Simpkins joined P/C Karpers and other Dundalk members at Fort McHenry to raise the flag on St. Patrick's Day.

**Public Courses** – P/C Brooks Riley's Squadron Boating Course at Dundalk High School is still continuing from its February start, because of several snow cancellations and spring break just ended. The final exam is planned for 01 May. Meanwhile, our March 22 and April 17 Squadron Boating Courses are consolidating for their second session at Anchorage Marina April 19, P/Lt/C Ray Schiff instructing.

GPS is scheduled for a May 1 start. Students from the boating courses by then complete are expected to help populate the May 3 and May 8 sessions – the GPS "short course".
