



5 people rescued off N.C.

The Charleston-registered Lazy Jack traveled the oceans for nearly 30 years, from the Indian Ocean to the Caribbean and the Atlantic seaboard, but was claimed by the sea Saturday night as the Coast Guard rescued her crew of five.

The Lazy Jack, a 48-foot Cheoy Lee blue-water cruising sloop, was off North Carolina about 32 miles south of Cape Lookout when the distress call came in at 7:35 p.m., said Ensign Caleb Peacock of the Coast Guard Sector North Carolina Command Center in Atlantic Beach.

"When the helicopter arrived on scene, only a foot or two (of the boat) remained above the water," he said.

One crew member was hoisted up to the helicopter, a Jayhawk dispatched from Elizabeth City, while the remaining four chose to remain and were directed to launch their life raft, Peacock said. They were picked up by a rescue boat shortly before 10:30 p.m., and none of those rescued suffered injuries.

"The boat was being delivered from Puerto Rico to Beaufort, N.C., by a professional crew," said Paul Stinson of Mount Pleasant, owner of the Lazy Jack. "They ran into heavy weather and the boat started taking on water."

The Coast Guard had no further details on the rescue and did not provide the names of those rescued.

Peacock said the boat had earlier been boarded off Mayport, Fla., by the Cutter Harriet Lane. Peacock said he had no details about the boarding but thought it was to provide assistance.

- Repacked stuffing box
- Replaced cullasse bearing

THE CREW

Routine engine check

- Water rapidly filling engine well
- Water pump hose leaking water from thru-hull
 - Hammered a wood dowel into hose
 - Glued using one of two available boat-water glue
