



## USPS NATIONAL COMMANDER TO ATTEND DUNDALK'S CHANGE OF WATCH CEREMONIES

### Dundalk's Change of Watch is always the squadron's

biggest event of the year, but this year's will be really special. A guest for the evening will be the USPS National Commander, CC Ernie Marshburn, SN. It is very rare that a National Commander can make it even to district events, let alone a squadron function. Somehow, Dundalk's Commander Bernie Karpers, N got it to happen.

Marshburn presides over all of the 50,000+ members that makeup USPS.

After becoming a member of the Greenville, NC Tar River Power Squadron in 1983 and later moving through the bridge, Marshburn continued on regional assignments for several years. In 1994, he was elected commander of District 27, which boasted twenty squadrons in the Carolinas. He later served on several national committee assignments before election to the national bridge as National Secretary in 1999.

In his professional life, Marshburn has a Master's Degree in Science, an extensive background in information technology and high performance,



academic and research computing. Currently, he is Director of Strategic Initiatives for Research and Graduate Studies at East Carolina University. Collectively, he has almost 30 years of experience in higher education.

A dedicated sailor, CC Marshburn began boating in a Sunfish and Flying Scotts during the summer while working as a camp counselor. He and his wife, Dianne, owned and sailed a Canadian Sailcraft 36 for 13 years. He raced for many years, winning the North Carolina Sailing Championship in 1994. Together, studying and improving themselves, Ernie and Diane obtained their U.S. Coast Guard Masters licenses for 100 Ton vessels with sailing and towing endorsements in 2000.

When not inundated with USPS activities, Ernie and his wife enjoy cruising and scuba diving the waters of North Carolina and southern Chesapeake. In his community, he has been involved with the Children's Miracle Network Telethon, Literacy Volunteers, United Way, and the East Carolina University Pirate Club.

# COMMANDER

This is the second of a series of three columns about the USPS. Last month I discussed the squadron relationship with the national organization and presented examples of the impending effects of rules and by-laws changes upon our squadron. This month I want to discuss the relationship of the individual to the squadron.

Our by-laws are the agreed upon procedures for operation of the squadron. This agreement extends from the squadron to the members and to our parent organization. Our rules are established by local precedent interpretations of our by-laws. As such these two documents constitute a mutual agreement between the members and the organization for procedure of operation.

Our Bridge and elective members of the Executive Committee conduct the operation of the squadron. This body conducts the needed business to support the squadron. The Bridge operates with the various departments and standing committees. The committees assist the bridge in the management of squadron activities.

Our members derive benefits from this operation. These benefits are education in boating and lead to enjoyment of and efficient pursuit of our goal of safety in boating. The membership supports the squadron by participating in various activities of our standing and operating committees. For example, we provide opportunity for education of the members. picture. The membership supports the Education Department and the Executive Committee by participating in the courses available. Our Education Department, along with the executive department meet the civic need for boating education when we instruct the general public with our public Basic Boating Course. We also contribute to the general public with our Vessel Safety Check program. Again all of this is directed to our principal interest, safe boating.

During the summer months we have the opportunity to test the result of our education in the boating season. This squadron is particularly active in cruising and your participation adds to the enthusiasm of the squadron.

As a result of participation in various squadron activities new friendships develop. This completes the triangle of education, public service and fraternal friendships.

So much for squadron activity. How does the cycle continue? Again this is where the individual enters the operation of the squadron. Now is the time we are seeking candidates for elected office or committee membership. This is the time you can volunteer for squadron service, or respond to the request for service to the squadron.

**Public Courses** - All 14 basic students who enrolled in our Squadron Boating Courses during the fall passed with flying colors. We are running a special GPS seminar for the majority of those students on January 9 and 16. We remain convinced that the Squadron Boating Course is the best way of attracting members, since it distinguishes us as serious boating educators and enthusiasts. So far five of the fourteen have joined, and we're working on others.

Dundalk's public course schedule for 2007 is now being distributed to boat stores and area publications, and is available on our website. The first class to be offered is scheduled for February 6, immediately after the Baltimore Boat Show. We have listed the all the classes through June 30 at [www.usps.org](http://www.usps.org), from which District 5 compiles the class list for distribution at the boat show. New this year with the advent of the USPS University program, its seminars are listed at the national website: we have now listed our Using GPS classes

with national visibility – hopefully that will improve enrollment. From our surveys last year, we understand most of our enrollment comes from the internet.

**Member courses** - We encourage all new members to enroll in the Seamanship class to be instructed by P/C Read van Zile. Just show up at the first class on January 30, 2007 at 7:30pm at St. John's Lutheran Church.
