



During the trip, the captain had a medical emergency and I must admit that even though I remained calm throughout the whole episode, listing the names all his medications and dosages was not something I could have done.

The Emergency Medical Record forms are free. Make sure your boating family and friends have an Emergency Medical Record filled out prior to any boating event or excursion. Actually, they should be carried at all times in the event of an emergency on or off the water.
