

On 1 May 2010 the Bridge of District Five, Past District Commanders, Squadron Cooperative Charting Chairmen, Cooperative Charting Committee members and guests attended the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration-United States Power Squadrons Workshop in Norfolk, Virginia.

P/R/C Steve Leishman, SN as D/5 Co-Op Chart Committee Chairman, D/Lt Robert A. Beltz, JN, Assistant Chair, along with instructors D/Lt Ken Perigo, SN, D/Lt David Bernard, AP, D/Lt Howard Manly, AP, Ron Babin of Ocean Grafix, P/R/C Patricia Greer, SN of Adopt-A-Chart, registration chairperson P/R/C Norma J. Parrish, AP, D/Lt Connie Beltz, AP along with Lt/Cdr Rick Brennan and Lt Sarah Mrozek of NOAA prepared an exceptional NOS/USPS workshop. Representatives from Districts Two, Four and Twenty-Seven and the above made a total of fifty in attendance. Topics were discussed such as Small Craft Charts and Facilities, Coast Pilot Books, Aids to Navigation, National Charts, Print-On-Demand chart printing, Adopt-A-Chart, USCG Light List, NOAA Catalog of Charts and Publications, worksheets, hand held GPS systems and digital cameras, and even having a good pencil with a good eraser.

The Cooperative Charting year begins April 1 and runs to March 31 each year. Let us take part and have pride in helping our community service committee of District Five in generating as many complete reports as possible. We should learn and have fun in doing cooperative charting.
